

RE on a Page at Brackley C of E Junior School

Non-negotiables

Displays: Year Group display in shared area between classrooms with a main header showing the main title of the unit of work and a separate heading next to this displaying the Big Question for the unit. The cover picture sheet is also displayed here together with finished pieces of children's work for each lesson with learning objectives on the work, all named.

Daily structure: the first lesson of each unit starts with the cover picture sheet in each child's book followed by the Knowledge Organiser (KO). Before each lesson the children write the long date and stick a Learning Objective with 3 success criteria objectives underneath which children self-assess at the end of the lesson.

Editing: Children should be given to opportunity to edit their written work which should be done in blue pen.

Assessment: Children self-assess at the end of each lesson as above and teacher adds their assessment to this during the lesson and highlights the LO in green to show if objective has been met. Most marking is live, up to 3 incorrect spellings are highlighted in pink (particularly unit related words or high frequency words). Pink is also added to misconceptions or to show an area of difficulty.

End of unit assessment based upon how far children have met the Learning Objectives in their RE books.

Lesson Structure

Each lesson has a written plan and a corresponding Powerpoint with a main question for the lesson. These build up through the sequence of lessons to create a learning journey. The lesson plan gives extra information to support the powerpoint.

Work through the Powerpoint together with the class, allowing the children to complete each activity as a class, individually, in pairs or groups (the lesson plan may act as a guide on this).

It is imperative that the teacher familiarises themselves with the content of the KO and any essential information provided in the Core Resources for each unit to provide them with necessary subject knowledge to teach the unit.
